Phila. doctor to head physician organization

Nicole Davis, MD, to serve as first black president of PAFP

(HARRISBURG, PA.) The Pennsylvania Academy of Family Physicians (PAFP) is pleased to announce its 69th president – Nicole Davis, MD of the Mount Airy neighborhood of Philadelphia. Dr. Davis has 16 years of experience as a family physician and practices at Chestnut Hill Family Care Associates in Philadelphia. She is proud to serve as the PAFP’s first black president in the organization’s history, and will be installed during a ceremony at the PAFP’s Annual Business Meeting beginning at 6 p.m. on Friday, March 20, in the Villanova/Wayne room of the Sheraton Valley Forge in Valley Forge, with a dinner gala in her honor to follow.

Dr. Davis earned her Bachelor’s degree in biology from the University of Maryland in Princess Anne, Md. and her MD from the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine in Hershey, Pa. She completed her residency at Montgomery Family Practice Residency Program in Norristown, Pa. Dr. Davis has received various awards and recognitions throughout her career, including a Degree of Fellow from the American Academy of Family Physicians and the Thomas Leaman, MD Award for Excellence in and Dedication to Family Medicine from the Penn State College of Medicine. Dr. Davis’s past roles with the PAFP include Speaker and Vice Speaker of the House of Delegates, Resident Chair, and Student Delegate.

Dr. Davis loves to travel and serve her community through public health events, which she often does through her sorority, the Valley Forge Alumnae Chapter of the Delta Sigma Theta sorority. She is expecting her first child, with husband Kareem Rogers, founder of Philadelphia youth nonprofit Greatness Is In You, “any day now,” in her words.

As president, Dr. Davis will serve as the PAFP’s spokeswoman. She will be responsible for appointing all standing and special commissions and committees, including public policy, practice advocacy, planning, member services, student and resident affairs, and finance.
