

Monroeville doctor to head physician organization

(HARRISBURG, PA. Feb. 28, 2020) Tracey Conti, MD, a Monroeville family physician, has been named the 74th president of the Pennsylvania Academy of Family Physicians (PAFP). Conti will be installed as president at a ceremony at the PAFP's Annual Business Meeting at the Hotel Hershey in Hershey, 12:25 p.m. on Friday, March 6, as part of the PAFP's Hershey CME Conference.

Conti began her medical career at the Temple University School of Medicine in Philadelphia. She completed her residency training in family medicine at the University of Maryland School of Medicine in Baltimore, where she served as chief resident.

Conti is the Program Director of the Family Medicine Residency Program at UPMC McKeesport. She has held appointments at Howard University, the University of Maryland, and the University of Pittsburgh. She has held various positions with the PAFP, including as a member of the Board of Directors and on the Resident and Student Committee.

Conti who is an emergency medicine physician and pastor of Emmanuel Baptist Church in Rankin.
