WHEREAS, it is estimated that family physicians are the only specialists qualified to treat most ailments and provide comprehensive health care for people of all ages — from newborns to seniors; and

WHEREAS, physicians focus on patient care of all kinds: acute, chronic, preventative, geriatric, palliative, prenatal, and safety-netting; and

WHEREAS, family medicine and primary care medicine are associated with better health outcomes, lower costs, increases in healthy equity and equity of access, fewer heart disease and cancer deaths, reduced low birthweight and infant mortality, longer life expectancy, fewer hospital admissions and readmissions, improved mental health outcomes, greater medications and prescription adherence, increased vaccinations and immunizations, and increased preventative screenings; and

WHEREAS, the well-being of Pennsylvanians is important and family physicians are the cornerstone of medicine to keep individuals of the Commonwealth healthy.

THEREFORE, I, Josh Shapiro, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby proclaim October 2024 to be
