PAFP Leadership

All of the activities and priorities of the PAFP are guided by its members, led by an elected 12-member board of directors. The board of directors includes physicians, a resident, a student, and a Family Medicine Residency Program Director representative. Elected officers of the board include President, President-elect, Treasurer and Foundation President. Elections are held each year and all members are encouraged to vote at the Annual Business Meeting each spring. Advocacy

The AAFP represents you and your specialty in Washington, DC. The PAFP does the same in Harrisburg — fighting to protect you and your patients. Our team of lobbyists advocate for and against legislation that will impact you, your patients and the specialty of family medicine. State government affairs has emerged with greater importance over the years, and we conduct our lobbying affairs with the utmost integrity, civility, and always in good faith.

Sometimes, we need your help. Keep an eye out for important "Action Alerts" asking for you to contact your legislators through the online SPEAK OUT portal, which makes it easy to connect you with the appropriate state official. This is an easy way to engage in advocacy and make your voice heard.

PAFP-PAC

The PAFP-PAC is the official, bipartisan political action committee of family medicine in Pennsylvania. Through individual, voluntary contributions, PAFP-PAC supports candidates for the state legislature who demonstrate an interest in the issues facing family physicians and their patients. Our PAC is governed by a dedicated board of directors, which determines financial support based on an examination of the concerns, responsiveness and support of family medicine positions and values. By investing in PAFP-PAC, you join your colleagues in creating a stronger voice for family physicians in Harrisburg. In today's environment, PACs are an important part of the political process and a necessary advocacy tool.

Contributions to PAFP-PAC are not tax deductible and corporate contributions are prohibited by law.

Education/Professional Development

Each year, the PAFP offers three in-person events: spring, summer and fall.

In the spring and fall, one-day **Family Medicine Essentials Summits** offer the state-mandated child abuse recognition and reporting training (ACT 31) and opioid and pain management education (ACT 124) you need for each two-year licensure cycle. The Summits offer additional CME sessions that cover a variety of important topics, all of which count toward your Patient Safety requirements.

Co-located and concurrent with the Spring FM Essentials Summit each year, **Research Day** is a showcase for students, residents, fellows, faculty and community physicians to share their original research projects, QI projects, case presentations, community and public health projects and compete for cash prizes. The **Summer CME Conference** offers four days of fun and CME in a relaxing, family-friendly location. The agenda for this conference always includes plenty of free time, so you can balance work and play — and spend time with family and friends (or a good book!). This is our largest conference of the year. You won't want to miss it!
