PENNSYLVANIA FAMILY PHYSICIAN MONTH September 2021

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's family physicians emphasize the importance of promoting wellness and providing preventive primary care services necessary to restrain ever-increasing health care costs and improve public and community health; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania needs more highly educated and expertly skilled primary care physicians, especially in medically underserved areas; and

WHEREAS, family physicians in the commonwealth have been on the front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic and have been integral to the state's vaccination efforts; and

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Academy of Family Physicians (PAFP) is one of the largest medical specialty organizations in the commonwealth and represents more than 6,000 members, including practicing family physicians, family medicine residents, and medical students. PAFP members are dedicated to the dignity and wellbeing of all Pennsylvanians by providing quality, comprehensive, and accessible health care; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Pennsylvania Academy of Family Physicians encourage medical students to choose a career in family medicine and provide primary care medical services in medically underserved areas and have been instrumental in the commonwealth's retention of the majority of its family medicine resident physicians.
